Meeting was called to order 14:15 by the Chair.

<u>Approval of the agenda</u>: Motion to accept – John Lassiter and <u>seconded</u> by Jerry Hunt. <u>Approved</u>
<u>Reading of 4/17/04 Minutes</u>: The minutes were read by the Secretary, Elmo Reddick. <u>Motion</u> by Ted Lungwitz to approve as read, <u>seconded</u> by Jerry Hunt; <u>approved</u>.

<u>Reports:</u>

- a. Treasurer—Carl Bishop; Bank balance of \$2000 less \$520 of reserved funds for purchase of Patches \$1480 of which \$760 are for dues beyond 2004; leaving \$720 in operating funds. Motion to accept by Jerry Hunt; Seconded by Ted Lungwitz. Approved.
- b. Patch Orders—Carl Bishop reported; only about a third of the Patches have been sold to date, The reserved funds used to purchase patches is slow being recovered.
- c. New & Renewed Members-Carl; there have been several renewals and some new members, we are at 79...
- d. Decal—Ted Lungwitz; reported the decal is a window, alumni association logo design. The artwork will cost a \$100 one-time setup fee. The BOD asked Ted to check if 50% of fee can be paid. Since our fund is low, Ted offered to pay the up-front cost and recover his out-of-pocket from decal sales or when the Funds has recovered. Motion by Ted to temporarily absorb cost, Seconded by Jerry Hunt. Approved unanimously.
